Land Trusts



- Manage and protect private land through donations, acquisitions and conservation agreements (covenants and easements)
- Provide donors with charitable tax receipt based fair market value of the property



- Protect important natural areas or wildlife habitats with a mission to managing and stewarding the land in perpetuity
- Aim to protect land for generations to come

RVCF

- Protects vulnerable habitat including wetlands, shorelines, and forests
- Works with willing landowners
- Follows detailed assessment criteria

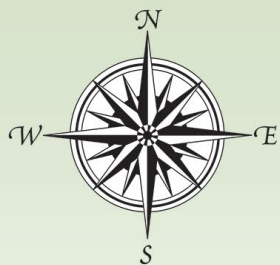


RVCF
